Deputy President Prof. Kithure Kindiki officially launched the Misufini A Village Electrification Project in Rabai Constituency, Kilifi County, reaffirming the Government's commitment to equitable development through expanded access to electricity.

Accompanied by Rabai MP Hon. Anthony Kenga Mupe, the Deputy President noted that no region would be left behind in the national electrification programme. Upon completion, the project is expected to connect 149 households to the national grid, creating opportunities for economic growth and social transformation.

Reliable electricity will enable school-going children to study

under better conditions while providing local businesses with the power required to expand operations and create employment opportunities.

The project forms part of ongoing efforts to improve quality of life and stimulate development in rural communities through modern energy infrastructure.

GOVERNMENT COMMITS KSH 517 MILLION TO ELECTRIFICATION IN LAMU

The Principal Secretary for Energy, Mr. Alex Wachira, presided over the launch of the Sinambio and Ngoi Lakwa Electrification Projects in Lamu West Constituency, underscoring the Government's commitment to accelerating electricity access across the coastal region.

During the event, the PS announced that KSh 517 million has been allocated for electrification projects in Lamu County, with KSh 270 million specifically earmarked for Lamu West Constituency. He further revealed that more than 2,400 households in the county had already been connected to electricity this year.

The projects are expected to improve access to reliable energy, stimulate local economic activity, and support public services across the constituency.

CS OPIYO WANDAYI COMMISSIONS ELECTRIFICATION PROJECTS IN BARINGO NORTH

REREC leadership tours ongoing electrification projects in South Nyanza Region

The team inspected a rural electrification project in Chirichiro Village, Nyaribari Chache Constituency, Kisii County, which is expected to connect approximately 100 households to electricity. The visit also provided an opportunity to engage local residents and reaffirm the Government's commitment to expanding energy access as a driver of socio-economic development. The delegation later held a staff engagement session in Kisii Town where discussions focused on project delivery, service excellence, and staff welfare.

The initiative is expected to improve livelihoods through increased access to reliable electricity for homes, schools, healthcare facilities, and businesses.

OTHAYA LAUNCHES AMBITIOUS SERVICE CABLE DROPS PROGRAMME

Residents of Othaya Constituency are set to benefit from increased electricity access following the launch of the Othaya Service Cable Drops Phase I Project. Launched by area MP Hon. Michael Wambugu Wainaina, the initiative targets households located within a 600-metre radius of existing transformers and is expected to connect hundreds of homes. The project is designed to accelerate connectivity, support enterprise growth, and improve quality of life by bringing affordable electricity closer to residents.

Residents of Essere Village in Luanda Constituency are already experiencing the benefits of electricity following the commissioning of a Last Mile Connectivity Project that connected 79 households. Implemented at a cost of KSh 7.5 million, the project is expected to support businesses, improve household welfare, and create new opportunities for economic growth.

The commissioning was led by area MP Hon. Dick Maungu and attended by REREC officers led by Vihiga County Supervisor Charles Onyango.
