REREC CONDUCTS PUBLIC SENSITIZATION ON ELECTRIFICATION PROJECTS IN KAKAMEGA

The West Kenya Region conducted a series of stakeholder engagement and public sensitization forums in Kakamega County to educate residents about ongoing rural electrification projects.

The barazas were held at Lugusi Farm and Shitirira electrification projects in Malava Constituency and Mukwa and Bukhubalo projects in Navakholo Constituency.

The four projects, currently under construction, are expected to benefit more than 500 households once completed.

Residents were sensitized on REREC's mandate, project timelines, connection requirements, wiring standards and the importance of granting wayleaves. They were also educated on electrical safety and energy-saving practices.

The sessions also promoted renewable energy solutions including biogas systems, solar power, improved biomass cookstoves and fireless cookers.
